Project Goals	Other Expenses	Market Performance
 Set goals that are project specific, realistic, and attainable. Goals should be appropriate for member's age and skill level. Create a realistic and useful plan to help you achieve your goal. 	 Record all other expenses. Items such as show supplies, entry fees, stall rent, etc. should be included. Do not include items such as farm utilities, gas to fair, or show clothes. 	 Calculate pounds of gain after each time weighed. Answer questions at the bottom of page based on your animal's performance. Ending Weight – Beginning Weight = Weight Gained
Beginning Inventory	Income Record	Activity Log
 Only record items that you own at the beginning of project year. Do not include items such as show clothes, pickup, trailer, barns, etc. 	 Include any income you made throughout the year with your projects. I.e., premium money, sale check 	 Minimum of 1 community service activity should be a 4-H Club sponsored activity. Other community service activities may be listed in addition. At least 1 4-H Project specific demonstration should be given at a 4-H Club meeting. 4-H specific leadership activities or events should be recorded 4-H offers a large variety of leadership activities. There is no reason this section should be left blank or have N/A recorded. Competitions participated in other than county fair should be recorded. For example: jackpot shows, state fair, quiz bowl, judging.

 Raised Animals Animals you raised or own at the start of your project. Purchased Animals Animals you purchased during project year. 	 List animals that you still own at the end of the project year. The value of your animal(s) should increase over the course of the year as you have put feed and time into them. 	 Tell about your 4-H experience over the year. Include details about your livestock from the beginning to end. When read by someone who has not been around your project, your story should give them a look into your experience. Utilize topics listed to help guide you, but other details and information should be included.
Health Record	Ending Equipment Inventory	Photos
 Record all health treatments with correct information. Cost for each treatment will be recorded in this section. Tasks such as cleaning pens or waterers do not classify as a health treatment. Discuss daily chores in your story. All animals will require some sort of health treatment. If you don't doctor your animal here are some examples: Hoof Trimming Clipping Fly Control 	 Record all equipment that you own at the end of the project year. If you purchased new equipment throughout the year, it should be listed here. Items you sold or used up should not be included on this page. Items such as show clothes, pickup, trailer, barns, etc. should not be included. 	 Minimum of 4 photos is required. More photos are acceptable. Photos should show progression of your project from beginning to end. Not all photos should be of just county fair. Captions must be included to help explain photos. Photos should be a visual aid to help explain your project and story.
Feed Record	Income Statement	Goal Reflection
 Record all feed that you purchase for your animals. If you rent stall space or board your animal, list this in Other Expenses. You do not need to calculate a total for units purchased just total feed cost. 	 Use data you recorded throughout the year to complete this page. All sections are color-coded to help you input the proper information. Answer questions at bottom of page based on information in your income statement. Be sure all totals are inputted correctly, and all math is correct. Income – Expenses = Profit/Loss 	 Discuss whether you achieved your goal or not. What helped you or kept you from reaching your goal?
